Here's your primetime primer

Tips to help you get your youth ready for the big event

ARE Meet and Greets are a fun day that allow waiting children and waiting approved families to interact in the hopes of finding an adoptive match. These events are effective for recruitment, but also can be emotionally charged for both the children and families who attend. As their adoption worker, it is crucial for you to prepare them for the day, to allow them to enjoy themselves and promote the best matches. A quick conversation about the event can really go a long way. Here are a few things to help guide you:

BeYOUtiful!

Remind them to be themselves. Our main goal is for the child and family to have fun while showing their true personalities. Not everyone is the best artist or the best at relay races, but each child and each parent is their best self. Being true and genuine is how real matches are made. Find ways to encourage this to remove any pressure they may be feeling.

Watch your language!

We all know kids repeat everything they hear, and they hear more than we think sometimes. If at

a visit or FTM or other meeting, you talk to them about being "matched," they may not understand their case status or circumstance. The term matched is very subjective in our adoption and recruitment world. If a child is truly matched with a family, he or she does not need recruitment efforts, and therefore

shouldn't be in attendance at a Meet & Greet. If a family who previously inquired on your waiting youth is attending the event, think of how you can communicate this to the child. "I met a cool family, and I am talking with their adoption worker to see if they are cool enough for you."; "I got to know Laura and Joe and they seem really nice. I heard they are coming today as well so you'll get to tell me eet if you think they are nice, too." Remember they will repeat what they hear so it will not benefit anyone if the child

spends the afternoon telling all the families he or she is already "matched."

Safety first!

To allow for a successful day, MARE staff always begins the day with an orientation to review the rules. The word "rules" can come across harsh, but MARE staff discuss a few areas that help them understand that the day is about having fun. We remind them they are going home with whoever brought them to the event. We chat about what topics are good to bring up when talking with families and their peers as well as some that are not so good. We inform them where the bathrooms are and let them know their chaperone or a MARE staff member must accompany them on trips to the bathroom. Last, we go over the schedule of the day so there are no surprises about what is going to happen when, in




Meet Hannah, eager to jump in ...

MARE's new Communications Specialist


