

When the Waggoner family became licensed foster parents five years ago, they hoped to make a difference in a child's life. What they didn't expect was how deeply that child—Bella—would change theirs.

Candace and Seth Waggoner, along with their three kids (Keegan, Eleanor, and Raegan) and their energetic dog Snookie, were already an active household when they received a call: a child needed a long-term home. That call led them to Bella. "She was photolisted on MARE," Candace recalls. "After talking with her worker and showing interest, we filed an intent to adopt."

Bella's move into the Waggoner home came with understandable nerves. "It was kind of scary at first," she said. "But they made me feel safe and included. I really like it here." As the oldest sibling, Bella brought new energy and lessons into the family. "We've had to learn how to meet everyone's needs in different ways," said Seth. "Exploring Bella's interests has been so fun." Bella embraced her role, too. "I actually have to look out for my siblings," she said with a smile. "Responsibility is very big now."

Even little Eleanor now includes Bella in her drawings—a sweet reminder of how strong their family bond has become. Throughout their journey, the Waggoners leaned on support from MARE and their Match Support Specialist, Jenna. "She checked in weekly and gave us helpful tools, like a bonding journal," said Candace. "It helped us connect more deeply with Bella. We felt very supported during our post-adoption process and would recommend it to anyone."

Jenna fondly remembers their time together: "It was an absolute joy working with the Waggoner family! Mr. and Mrs. Waggoner are truly wonderful advocates for Bella. It was wonderful to watch their bond grow and get to where it is today."

Despite unexpected challenges, including a tree falling on their home, the Waggoners remained resilient. "Life gets busy," Candace said, "but when you have the right supports in place, you can handle anything. The process isn't always easy, but the love is worth it."

These days, the Waggoner family enjoys movie nights, meal planning, camping trips, and lots of laughter. And now, with Bella in the mix, those moments are even sweeter.

To fellow families on this journey, the Waggoners offer this advice: "Anyone can do this. The system can seem intimidating at first, but with support and love, you'll find your way. Just don't be afraid to ask for help."
