Helping youth shine on MARE website Use these tools for telling terrific tales about them

You know that all the children on the MARE website are extraordinary, yet conveying their amazing attributes in a narrative sometimes becomes difficult.

That's why getting the "What I Want People To Know About Me" – or "All About Me" – and the "What Others Say" forms filled out is important. These MARE forms can make a child's narrative outstanding.

For instance, check out the narrative for Kevin (C09128). His worker not only had Kevin fill out the youth form, but she also completed the "What Others Say" document. As a result, adoptive families learn that "any family would be blessed to have Kevin."

Getting the forms filled out can lead to attention-getters such as the one for Nehehmiah (C08346) that reads, "Nehemiah is serving notice to all those restauranteurs out there. Give him a chef's hat and an apron, let him learn what it's like cooking on the line and get yourself a top chef." Since Nehemiah filled out the "All About Me" form, potential adoptive families learn that his faith is important to him, and he enjoys going to church.

Filling out the "What Others Say" form becomes particularly helpful when children are unsure about their adoption plan and aren't forthcoming with information about themselves. Even if you don't know much about a child, chances are pretty good that someone at the child's placement knows more. He or she can fill out the form to provide more details for a narrative.

MARE's Calendar of Events – A contract reminder –

MARE would like to take this opportunity to remind agencies that adherence to contractual obligations, as well as policy and procedures, ensures that children of Michigan's child welfare system will be uniformly served, resulting in opportunities to connect children with forever families.

Section 210(c)(8) of the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services Contractual Agreement refers to MARE Related Responsibilities and states: "The contractor shall notify MARE no less than quarterly of planned adoption related events, scheduled or tentatively scheduled for the next quarter. These activities shall include but are not limited to orientations, training dates, workshops, adoption fairs, recruitment activities, post adoption support activities and guest speakers. The contractor will indicate if the events are open to the public or limited to a specific audience and any costs for family participation."

Remember to submit your events at least quarterly to MARE Support Staff Karen Gowan at karen_gowan@judsoncenter.org. This can also be done via MARE's Calendar of Events Form, through a Contact Us form submission on the MARE website or by simply emailing your event flyer to mare@judsoncenter.org. MARE applauds the efforts of Michigan's adoption workers to find forever families for children waiting to be adopted and welcomes the opportunity to provide information, referral and support to all those who promote adoption.

The forms also come in handy when meeting a child on your caseload face-to-face for the first time. You can print the forms and take them with you as a way to get acquainted with the child and set him or her at ease.

By having the forms filled out, you

supply MARE with more information about the children you oversee, which leads to better stories about how incredible they are. The forms provide a unique insight into each child's personality that can be conveyed in his or her narrative.

And because children's likes and

dislikes as well as personalities constantly change, you can use the forms for the yearly updates of their narratives.
