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# Meet MARE's new videographer

# MARE makes website updates to help workers and their supervisors

MARE Data Analyst Jeremiah Balazovich shares some recent improvements made to the website.

### Supervisors can now view their staff's dashboards!

Any staff who are assigned to a supervisor can be selected from the "Viewing Dashboard for:" drop-down menu (highlighted in the below screenshot), allowing the supervisor to view that staff's dashboard. This new feature is dependent on staff selecting their correct supervisor on their Worker Profile page. This page can be accessed via your Worker Dashboard, and then clicking on the "Edit My Profile" button (circled in the screenshot below).

## Children's adoption workers can view the Inquiry Outcome Reports submitted by the family's adoption worker, and vice versa.

Adoption workers for children can view the Inquiry Outcome Reports that were submitted by the family's adoption worker by clicking on the "View Family Worker Report" link associated with that inquiry that was submitted for their child.
