Secret messages with lemon juice

Materials you'll need:

Half of a lemon

Water

Small bowl

Cotton swabs

Paper

Lamp

Step 1 – Gather your materials

Step 2 – Squeeze lemon juice into a bowl and mix in a few drops of water

Step 3 – Dip your cotton swab

in the mixture and use it as a pencil to write a secret message on the paper. Then, let the paper dry completely.

Step 4 – When you're ready, hold your paper close to the lamp's lightbulb and watch as your secret message begins to appear! You may need to ask an adult for help.

How does this work?

According to the website KiwiCo.com, "Lemon juice is mostly made of a variety of sugars, acids, and water.
Normally, lemon juice is mostly clear, so when you dilute it even further in water, and paint that mixture onto some paper, you can't see it. However, heating up lemon juice causes some of its sugars to react with oxygen in the air (oxidation), which turns these sugars brown. Your invisible ink might seem like magic, but really, it's all just chemistry."

When and how to apply for college

Going to college is a big decision!

Here are some things to remember

Here are some things to remember when applying to college:

 Begin early – it is recommended to start applying by the time you start your senior year of high school. Most applications are due by January if you'd like to attend in the fall semester.

 Prep work – make a list of colleges you'd like to go to, learn what their application requirements are, take standardized tests, gather letters of recommendation, write essays and visit the campus. Check on progress – there may deadlines for honors programs, scholarships and financial aid, so keep track with a calendar or spreadsheet.
